Senior Val Angel, an accounting major pursuing grad school obtain the title of a Certified Public Accountant, has the opportunity to run at the same institution where she would be studying. With the NCAA granting athletes extra seasons of eligibility due to COVID-19, Angel would be able to run one more season of both cross country and track for her new school.
